Key Vocabulary

race	Race refers to a person's physical characteristics, such as bone structure and skin, hair, or eye color.
racism	The belief that one race is superior or inferior to another.
segregation	The action or state of setting someone or something apart from others.
discrimination	The unjust treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of race, age, sex, or disability.
prejudice	Making a decision on something or someone not based on reason or real experience.
gender	Being male or female.
Equality Act	An act passed in 2010 to protect people from harassment, discrimination and victimisation.
sexual orientation	A person's identity in relation to the gender(s) to which they are attracted.
homophobic	Having or showing a dislike of or prejudice against gay people.
