### Key Vocabulary

<b>disability</b>	A physical or mental condition that limits a person's movements, senses, or activities.
<b>society</b>	People living together in a more or less ordered community.
<b>debt</b>	A sum of money that is owed or due.
<b>earn</b>	To obtain money for work or services.
<b>salary</b>	A fixed payment usually paid monthly as part of a yearly wage.
<b>tax</b>	A compulsory payment to the government to help pay for schools and hospitals etc.
<b>poverty</b>	The state of being extremely poor.
<b>war</b>	A state of armed conflict between different countries or different groups within a country.
<b>migration</b>	Movement of people to a new area or country in order to find work or better living conditions.
<b>immigration</b>	The action of coming to live permanently in a foreign country.
<b>asylum</b>	The protection given to someone who has left their country to escape danger.
<b>refugee</b>	A person who has left their country to escape danger or natural disaster.
