Concepts

Colour - We are surrounded by colour – take a look! There are three primary colours: red, blue and yellow. They can be used to mix secondary colours: green, purple and orange.

Tone - Differences in light and dark, tint or shade of colour to show effect of light on colour and form. Darker tones or tints can be made by adding black to a colour.

Enquiry Questions

- What inspires and influences Pete McKee's artwork?
- How does Pete McKee like to present his work - are there any unusual ways?
- Can you create your own Pete McKee style artwork, to show who you live with?
- When were the first cartoons created and how have they developed?

Key Vocabulary

Influence: A person or thing with the capacity to have an influence on someone or something.

Cartoon: A simple drawing showing the features of its subjects in a humorously exaggerated way.

Vibrant: Bright and striking.

Portrait: A painting, drawing or photograph of a person.

Complex: Consisting of many different parts.

Landscape: A picture representing an area of land.

- He was a postman and got rejected from art college.
- In 2005, he sold his first painting and in 2011, he opened his own gallery.
- He draws cartoons for the Sheffield Telegraph's sport section.
