### Key Vocabulary

screen	A flat panel or area on an electronic device such as a television, computer, or smartphone, on which images and data are displayed.
connect	Join together so as to provide access and communication.

personal	Of or concerning one's private life, relationships, and emotions rather than one's career or public life
information	Facts provided or learned about something or someone.
private	Belonging to or for the use of one particular person or group of people only.
race	Each of the major groupings into which mankind is considered to be divided on the basis of physical characteristics of shared ancestry.
racism	Prejudice, discrimination or antagonism by an individual, community or institution against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically, one that is a minority.
skin tone	The colour of the surface of someone's skin.
anti-racism	The policy or practice of opposing racism and promoting racial equality.
