#### Concepts

**Relationships** – learning to recognise healthy relationships, both in person and online.

**Safety** – the condition of being safe; freedom from danger, risk, or injury. This includes physical and emotional safety, as well as online safety.

**Diversity** – the concept of diversity encompasses acceptance and respect. It means understanding that each individual is unique, and recognising our individual differences. These can be along the dimensions of race, ethnicity, gender or religious beliefs.

  - \*What is personal information?
- \*Do we have to tell someone our private and personal information?
  - \* What could happen if a stranger got your personal information?
    - \*What is 'fine to share'?
- \*Why would somebody lie on the Internet?

#### Key Questions for Anti-Racism

- \*What traits do you have?
  - \*What does bias mean?
    - \*Why could bias be a problem?
- \*Can you tell what a person is like by looking at them?
- \*Should we judge someone by how they look?
  - \*How would you feel if someone treated you unfairly because of the way you look?
    - \*How can people be discriminated against?
