Key Enquiry Question: What is the good news that Jesus brings?

Religion: Christianity

Concept:

Beliefs, teachings and sources

Interpreting teachings, sources, authorities and ways of life in order to understand religions and beliefs.

Understanding and responding critically to beliefs and attitudes.

Values and commitments

Understanding how moral values and a sense of obligation can come from beliefs and experience.

Key Vocabulary

Bible	Christian holy book: collection of religious texts/scriptures.
Gospel	Means 'Good News'. Biblical narratives about Jesus.
Friendship	Mutual trust between others.
Forgiveness	Decision to let go on resentment.
Peace	Tranquillity, harmony and security.

RE Skills

To tell stories from the Bible and recognise a link with a concept of 'Gospel' or good news.

To give clear, simple accounts of what Bible texts (such as the story of Matthew the tax collector) mean to Christians.

To recognise that Jesus gives instructions to people about how to behave.

To give at least two examples of ways in which Christians follow the teachings studied about forgiveness and peace, and bringing good news to the friendless.

To give at least two examples of how Christians put these beliefs into practice in the Church community and their own lives (for example: charity, confession).

To think, talk and ask questions about whether Jesus' 'good news' is only good news for Christians, or if there are things for anyone to learn, exploring different ideas.
