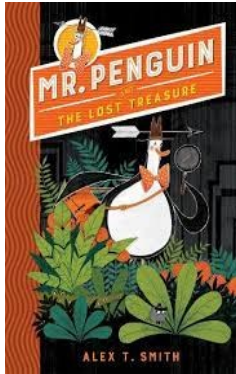

Mr Penguin and the Lost Treasure

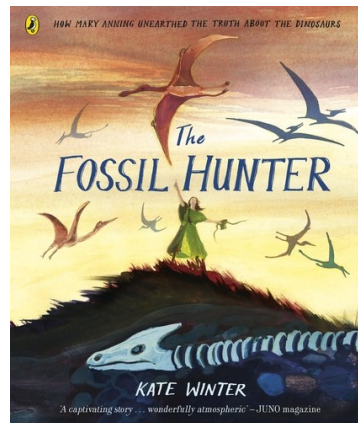

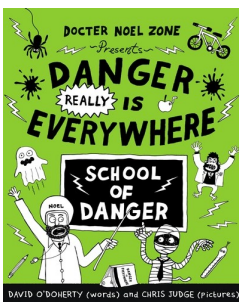


Winter's Child

Danger Really Is Everywhere

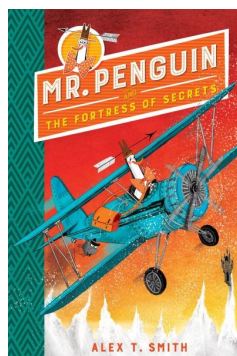
