Features	A distinctive attribute or aspect of something.
Racism	When someone treats a person or group of people unfairly or thinks they are inferior because of their skin colour.
Anti-racist	Is an ongoing active effort to challenge all types of racism in society.
Systematic	Relating to the whole of a system.

Concepts

Respect - This is a concept that refers to the ability to value and honour another person, both his or her words and actions, even if we do not approve or share everything he or she does.

Safety - The concept of safety is the condition of being safe; freedom from danger, risk, or injury. These include being physically and emotionally safe, as well as online safety. relationships.

Diversity – the concept of diversity encompasses acceptance and respect. It means understanding that each individual is unique, and recognising our individual differences. These can be along the dimensions of race, ethnicity, gender or religious beliefs.
