Key Vocabulary

control	The power to influence or direct people's behaviour or the course of events.
consent	Permission for something to happen or agreement to do something.
manipulation	The action of manipulating someone in a clever or unscrupulous way.
public	Done, perceived, or existing in open view.
catfish	Lure (someone) into a relationship by means of a fictional online persona.
protect	Keep safe from harm or injury.
valuable	Worth a great deal of money.
sensitive	Kept secret or with restrictions on disclosure to avoid endangering security.
password	A secret word or phrase that must be used to gain admission or access.
prejudice	A preconceived opinion, not based on reason or actual experience.
privilege	A special right or advantage, available only to a particular person or group.
discrimination	Unjust treatment of different categories of people, on grounds of ethnicity, age, sex or disability.

Concepts

Relationships – learning to recognise healthy relationships, both in person and online.

Safety – the condition of being safe; freedom from danger, risk, or injury. This includes physical and emotional safety, as well as online safety.
