Key Vocabulary

friend	A person with whom one has a bond of mutual affection.
family	A group of one or more parents and their children living together as a unit.
stranger	A person whom one does not know or with whom one is not familiar.
acquaintance	A person one knows slightly, but who is not a close friend.
different	Not the same as another or each other; unlike in nature, form, or quality.
feelings	An emotional state or reaction.

Key Concepts:

Respect – This is a concept that refers to the ability to value and honour another person, both his or her words and actions, even if we do not approve or share everything he or she does.

Diversity – The concept of diversity encompasses acceptance and respect. It means understanding that each individual is unique, and recognising our individual differences.

Relationships - This concept focuses on relationships between family and friends. Children learn an awareness of different types of families and how they are of equal importance, challenging stereotypes of a 'normal family'.
