Key Enquiry Question: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

Religion: Christianity

Concepts:

Salvation

(Easter units) Christian's relationship with God and needing to find peace and freedom.

Expressing meaning

Appreciating that individuals and cultures express their beliefs and values through many different forms.

Key Vocabulary

Holy Week	The week before Easter which includes Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
Palm Sunday	Jesus' entry into Jerusalem in which branches of palms are carried.
Good Friday	Crucifixion of Jesus and his death.
Easter Sunday	Commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
Maundy Thursday	Commemorates the Washing of the Feet and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles.
despair	The complete loss or absence of hope.
hope	A feeling of expectation and desire for a particular thing to happen.

RE Skills

- Offer suggestions about what the narrative of the Last Supper, Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial might mean.
- Give examples of what the texts studied mean to some Christians.
- Make clear links between Gospel texts and how Christians remember, celebrate and serve on Maundy Thursday, including Holy Communion.
- Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus in their everyday lives: for example, prayer, serving, sharing the message and the example of Jesus.
- Raise questions and suggest answers about how serving and celebrating, remembering and betrayal, trust and standing up for your beliefs might make a difference to how pupils think and live and teachings in the Bible and life in the world today, expressing some ideas of their own clearly.
