Key Vocabulary

consent	To give permission or approval; agree.
private	Personal and not to be shared.
permission	The act of permitting. <i>With your permission, can I brush your hair?</i>
trusted adult	A trusted adult is someone that you have a good relationship with. It is someone who you think has your best interests in mind.
secret	Something that is kept or meant to be kept unknown or unseen by others.
surprise	A feeling of mild astonishment or shock caused by something unexpected. <i>The announcement came as a complete surprise.</i>
worried	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems.
gender	Gender means 'type'. It is a word commonly used to describe how a person identifies for example, as male or female.
different	Not the same/not of the same kind. Partly or totally unlike.

Concepts

Respect – the ability to value and honour another person, both his or her words and actions, even if we do not approve or share everything he or she does. It is accepting the other person and not trying to change them.

Diversity – understanding that each individual is unique, and recognizing our individual differences. These can be along the dimensions of race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, age, physical abilities, religious beliefs, political beliefs, or other ideologies.

Community – This concept teaches what it means to belong to a community.

Relationships - This concept focuses on relationships between family and friends. Children learn an awareness of different types of families and how they are of equal importance, challenging stereotypes of a 'normal family'.
