Concepts

Pattern - The arrangement of shapes, natural and man-made, decorative design on surface. (Zebra, tiger, daisy [petals], brickwork, wallpaper, wrapping paper, fabric designs, patterns from other cultures).

Form - Description of 3D shape; form has volume and occupies space, it can be regular e.g. a cube or sphere or irregular e.g. a stone, shell or a fir cone.

Enquiry Questions

- Can you explain what the figure scenes may tell you about ancient Greek or British life?
- Can you name the different techniques used to create a pot?
- What were the uses of Greek pottery and water features?
- Can you list the types of Greek pottery?
- Can you design your own garden water feature and write about its purpose?

Key Vocabulary

Figure: the depiction of a human or animal form.

Amphora: the most common type of ancient Greek pottery- a two-handled pot with a neck narrower than the body.

Silhouette: the dark shape and outline of someone or something visible in restricted light against a brighter background.

Key Facts

- Almost all garden water features are made in functional shapes for particular purposes, even if they are not actually used for that purpose.
- Ancient Greek pottery shows figure scenes which provide information about many aspects of Greek life.
- Early Greek pots featured black figures on a red background but from the 5th century BC onwards, they changed to red figures on black backgrounds.
- Each pot painter signed his or her work individually.
