**Theme:** Salvation

**Key Enquiry Question:** What did Jesus do to save human beings?

**Religion:** Christianity

**Concepts:**

Salvation

Christian's relationship with God and needing to find peace and freedom.

Identity, diversity and belonging

Understanding how individuals develop a sense of identity and belonging through faith or belief.

Exploring the variety, difference and relationships that exist within and between religions, values and beliefs.

### Key Vocabulary

Holy Week	The week before Easter which includes Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
stations of the cross	A series of fourteen pictures or carvings representing successive incidents during Jesus's progress which include his crucifixion and burial.
resurrection	The rising of Christ from the dead.
sacrifice	God and Jesus both give the ultimate sacrifice for the benefit of others, for our benefit.
communion	Sharing bread and wine as a remembrance of the love of Jesus, for our salvation from the bondage of sin and death.

### RE Skills

Explain what Christians mean when they say that Jesus' death was a sacrifice, using theological terms.

Suggest meanings for narratives of Jesus' death/ resurrection, comparing their ideas with ways in which Christians interpret these texts.

Make clear connections between the Christian belief in Jesus' death as a sacrifice and how Christians celebrate Holy Communion/Lord's Supper.

Show how Christians put their beliefs into practice.

Weigh up the value and impact of ideas of sacrifice in their own lives and the world today.
