Key Vocabulary

Marriage - A marriage is the relationship between two people who are married. It is enshrined in law.

Consent - Permission for something to happen, or an agreement to do something.

Wedding - A wedding is a marriage ceremony and the party or special meal that often takes place after the ceremony.

Gay - People who love or are attracted to people of the same gender.

Secret - Something that is kept, or meant to be unseen by others.

Surprise - A feeling of mild astonishment caused by something unexpected.

Unwanted - Not, or no longer desired.

Concepts

Relationships

This concept focuses on relationships between family and friends. Children learn an awareness of different types of families and how they are of equal importance, challenging stereotypes of a 'normal family'. Friendships are also unpicked, to understand what a good friendship looks like, understanding why people are unkind and accepting friends for who they are, even when going against social stereotypes. Healthy relationships are key within this concept, teaching right from wrong, to understand when a relationship is unhealthy, and to be in control of our own decisions.

Key Questions

- Why do some people get married?
- Can anyone make you get married?
- Does everyone get married?
- Can families ever be perfect?
- Who needs consent before they can touch your bodies?
- What can we do if someone is not asking for our consent to touch us?
- Does everyone have a healthy/happy home life?
- What can you do if you are worried about your home life?
