Key Vocabulary

marriage	A marriage is the relationship between two people who are married.
wedding	A wedding is a marriage ceremony and the party or special meal that often takes place after the ceremony.
gay	People who love or are attracted to people of the same gender.
consent	Permission for something to happen or agreement to do something.
secret	Something that is kept or meant to be kept unknown or unseen by others.
surprise	A feeling of mild astonishment or shock caused by something unexpected.
unwanted	Not or no longer desired.
fault	An error or mistake.
difference	A point or way in which people or things are dissimilar.
conventional	Someone who is conventional has behavior or opinions that are ordinary.

Concepts

- **Diversity** - means acceptance and respect. Understanding that each individual is unique and recognising differences. These include race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, age, physical abilities, religious beliefs, political beliefs, or other ideologies.
- **Relationships** - between family and friends. being aware of different types of families and how they are of equal importance, challenging stereotypes of a 'normal family'.
